

Political Playas Puzzle Pimps

San Diego Congressman-Sponsored Bill Would Up Penalties for Gang-Related Pimping and Pandering Even as CCDC Weighs Decision to Create "San Diego's Own Times Square" in Horton Plaza Park.

"It's like they built us a house, but they won't let us move in."

THE DEFUNCT HORTON PLAZA FOUNTAIN, DOWNTOWN - The Westfield Group, which owns Horton Plaza mall, has submitted a proposal to demolish the Robinson's-May building that currently forms the mall's northern facade. In its place, the Group is proposing a "Times Squarestyle park" where San Diegans from all walks of life could gather and enjoy themselves.

That's good news for The Royal Reverend Pimp Vizier Solomon, who currently runs a stable of 22 prime underage hos throughout the greater Gaslamp area for the Sherman Heights gang. Solomon says the park would give him a base of operations, "a dedi-

cated space" in which to conduct his affairs. "People come downtown looking for some fun, they need to know where they can go," says Vizier. "This park goes in; now they know. But now these Congressmen come in and step on my...business."

Solomon is referring to Assembly Bill 918, sponsored by Bonita Assemblyman Marty Block (and cosponsored in the Senate by San Diego Senator Mark Wyland), which would substantially increase the penalties for gang-related pimping and pandering. "These clowns need to figure out what they want," concluded Solomon. "The right life or the night life - what's it
