Rio Grande Resources Corporation (RGR) is hereby making application for renewing Standby Permit No. C 1002RE related to the Mt. Taylor Mine, according to the conditions of Permit Revision 98-1 dated December 18, 1998 and for compliance of NMAC 19.10 Part 7 and Subsection 19.10.5.505 of the New Mexico Mining Act Rules. All of the Mine Units listed in the 98-1 Revision are expected to remain on standby for the following 5 years including the Water Treatment Area units. Approval for renewal of standby status and permit modification for was previously approved on July 2005.

On December 18, 1998 the Mining and Minerals Division approved the closeout plan and financial security for the mine as an existing mining operation. Section 19.10.7.701.1 of the Rules states that Standby Status can be continued five or more years. Standby Status more accurately depicts the continued operational status of the mine.

The Mt. Taylor Mine was put on inactive status by the prior owners, Chevron Resources Corporation, in January 1990 due to low uranium market prices. Rio Grande Resources Corporation acquired the Mine property in 1991, and waited for the market conditions to be favorable for startup. Although some improvement in uranium price has occurred over the past five years, sufficient improvement is not expected for another four or five years. Should those changes in the market should occur sooner, RGR stands ready to initiate steps to reactivate the mine. In the mean time, RGR will continue to accept proposals for a long-term water supply project (WSP) to allow portions of the mine facilities to be operational and employ a limited number of people.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Mt. Taylor Mine is located near San Mateo, New Mexico in the East 1/2 of Section 24, Township 13 N, Range 8 W. Follow State Highway 605 from Milan, New Mexico 22 miles to arrive at San Mateo. The Mine is located approximately one mile northeast of the small village.

The employment level at the mine site has increased to a total of four. The contractors have increased to include five different companies.

The WSP is expected to start up during the following five years, but this cannot be assured as contracts are still being considered with various potential buyers of the water.

SEVEN MINE SITE UNITS WILL BE ADDRESSED FOR STANDBY

1.0 PLANT SITE UNIT- 93 ACRES

1.1 The Plant Site Unit includes most of the surface mine facilities. There has been no mining activity on the premises since January 1990. Work on the mine site is geared only to maintaining buildings, roads, drainage ditches, containment structures, and security requirements.

19.10.7.701.B(1) Identify the projected term of standby status –

The Plant Site may be on standby for an additional five years or possibly more. Work on the WSP could start as early as permitting allows.

1.2 19.10.7.701.B(2) Identify the projected term of standby status – Describe the measures to be taken to reduce, to the extent practicable, the formation of acid and other toxic drainage and to prevent releases that cause federal or state environmental standards to be exceeded –

There will be no acid and/or other toxic drainage off the plant site because none of these chemicals are produced or used even when the mine is operating. Releases of oil and gasoline are prevented by curbed concrete berms or constructed metal tanks beneath the storage tanks. Used oil is collected and transported to Milan, New Mexico to be recycled. Storm water, containing low levels of radioactive contaminants, is managed with, (1) run-off diversion ditches and (2) underground network of 24 inch piping which discharges into a lagoon for evaporation.

1.3 19.10.7.701.B(3) Describe how applicable federal and state environmental standards and regulations will be met during the duration of standby status and provide to the Director a written determination from the Secretary of the Environment Department stating that the permittee has demonstrated that the operation will be expected to achieve compliance with all applicable air, water quality and other environmental standards of the Environment Department during standby status if carried out as described —

Applicable Federal and State environmental standards and regulations will be met during the duration of standby status by complying with State Permit DP-61 and Federal Permits NPDES NM 0028100 and NPDES Storm Water Permit NMR05GB27. The NMED has written letters dated May 28, 1999 stating RGR will very likely be in compliance during the Standby period by following the current maintenance program.

The mine area has not been further disturbed since the 1998 mine permit was issued. All conditions described in that permit and in subsequent standby applications were deemed by NMED to be satisfactorily addressed then and have not changed since.

1.4 19.10.7.701.B(4) Describe how waste and storage units, leach piles, impoundments and pits will be stabilized during the duration of standby status –

This paragraph, 19.10.7.701.B4, does not apply to the Plant Site. Although there is no waste and storage units, leach piles, impoundments and pits in the plant site area, there are two vertical shafts, which are now completely enclosed to prevent any person or wildlife entry into the deep excavations, in the unlikely event that the security system is breached.

1.5 19.10.7.701.B(5) Describe how the applicable requirements of the Act and this Part will be met during the term of the standby status for the operations proposed for standby status –

RGR will continue to comply with the conditions and provisions of the Mine Permit Application, Mt. Taylor Closeout Plan, provisions and conditions of the Permit Revision 98-1 and will remain in compliance with NMAC-19.10. Part 7 of the New Mexico Mining Rules. The mine area has not been further disturbed since the 1998 mine permit was issued. All conditions described in that permit and in subsequent standby applications were deemed by MMD to be satisfactorily addressed then and have not changed since.

1.6 19.10.7.701.B(6) Provide an analysis of the anticipated future economic viability of the units proposed for standby status –

RGR has the largest uranium deposit in the United States, which is well over 100,000,000 pounds of U_3O_8 in the Mt. Taylor Mine ore body. The market price now does not permit a viable mining operation, primarily because of the availability of uranium from weapons decommissioning in the world and U. S. markets. However, such material will be used up after a period of time, after which market demand for new uranium oxide should increase. Additionally, in the future the demand for clean nuclear power generating plants will increase as low-cost coal reserves are depleted and demand for electric power increases. These conditions and the high grade ore reserves at Mt. Taylor will increase the value of the Mt. Taylor Mine and lead to resumption of operations in the relatively near future.

2.0 OLD WASTE ROCK PILE - 15.2 ACRES

2.1 19.10.7.701.B(1) Identify the projected term of standby status –

The old waste pile will be on standby for possibly another 5 years. However, if the mine should go into production earlier because of uranium price correction, the old waste pile will be put into use.

2.2 19.10.7.701.B(2) Describe the measures to be taken to reduce, to the extent practicable, the formation of acid and other toxic drainage and to prevent releases that cause federal or state environmental standards to be exceeded –

There is no acid generation or toxic waste accumulation in the old waste pile as shown by analysis of waste rock samples.

2.3 19.10.7.701.B(3) Describe how applicable federal and state environmental standards and regulations will be met during the duration of standby status and provide to the Director a written determination from the Secretary of the Environment Department stating that the permittee has demonstrated that the operation will be expected to achieve compliance with all applicable air, water quality and other environmental standards of the Environment Department during standby status if carried out as described —

The waste pile has been unused for approximately 20 years. There is no indication that the rock pile is any danger to humans or wildlife. Precipitation run-off is captured and collected in a containment basin for evaporation where solids remain confined. Wind blown particulates are at a minimum due to the clay content in the waste rock. There are no other regulations on waste rock piles that are a concern of state agencies.

The mine area has not been further disturbed since the 1998 mine permit was issued. All conditions described in that permit and in subsequent standby applications were deemed by NMED to be satisfactorily addressed then and have not changed since.

2.4 19.10.7.701.B(4) Describe how waste and storage units, leach piles, impoundments and pits will be stabilized during the duration of standby status –

The old waste pile is stabilized during standby by diversion of runoff, capture of sediment from the slopes, and prevention of saturation within the pile. Minor erosion is occurring, but is collected in a containment basin along with the run-off. The pile slopes have remained stable, without mass movement, for 20 years.

2.5 19.10.7.701.B(5) Describe how the applicable requirements of the Act and this Part will be met during the term of the standby status for the operations proposed for standby status –

RGR will continue to comply with the conditions and provisions of the Mine Permit Application, Mt. Taylor Closeout Plan, provisions and conditions of the Permit Revision 98-1 and will remain in compliance with NMAC-19.10. Part 7 of the New Mexico Mining Rules. The mine area has not been further disturbed since the 1998 mine permit was issued. All conditions described in that permit and in subsequent standby applications were deemed by MMD to be satisfactorily addressed then and have not changed since.

2.6 19.10.7.701.B(6) Provide an analysis of the anticipated future economic viability of the units proposed for standby status –

3.0 NEW ROCK WASTE PILE - 21.7 ACRES

3.1 19.10.7.701.B(1) Identify the projected term of standby status –

The New Waste Rock pile area has not been disturbed except for test pits to determine shale quality. Therefore, the area will be on standby until needed for waste rock disposal.

3.2 19.10.7.701.B(2) Describe the measures to be taken to reduce, to the extent practicable, the formation of acid and other toxic drainage and to prevent releases that cause federal or state environmental standards to be exceeded –

No acid generation potential or toxic waste accumulation.

3.3 19.10.7.701.B(3) Describe how applicable federal and state environmental standards and regulations will be met during the duration of standby status and provide to the Director a written determination from the Secretary of the Environment Department stating that the permittee has demonstrated that the operation will be expected to achieve compliance with all applicable air, water quality and other environmental standards of the Environment Department during standby status if carried out as described—

The mine area has not been further disturbed since the 1998 mine permit was issued. All conditions described in that permit and in subsequent standby applications were deemed by NMED to be satisfactorily addressed then and have not changed since.

3.4 19.10.7.701.B(4) Describe how waste and storage units, leach piles, impoundments and pits will be stabilized during the duration of standby status –

See responses to 3.1 and 3.3 above.

3.5 19.10.7.701.B(5) Describe how the applicable requirements of the Act and this Part will be met during the term of the standby status for the operations proposed for standby status –

RGR will continue to comply with the conditions and provisions of the Mine Permit Application, Mt. Taylor Closeout Plan, provisions and conditions of the Permit Revision 98-1 and will remain in compliance with NMAC-19.10. Part 7 of the New Mexico Mining Rules. The mine area has not been further disturbed since the 1998 mine permit was issued. All conditions described in that permit and in subsequent standby applications were deemed by MMD to be satisfactorily addressed then and have not changed since.

3.6 19.10.7.701.B(6) Provide an analysis of the anticipated future economic viability of the units proposed for standby status –

4.0 WATER TREATMENT AREA - 28 ACRES

4.1 19.10.7.701.B(1) Identify the projected term of standby status –

The water treatment area will be on standby until the WSP is agreed upon by all parties. The WSP might be activated within the next five years. Prior to pumping water, redesign construction work will be necessary to prepare the lagoons and upgrade the treatment facilities to achieve drinking water standards of water before release from the site.

4.2 19.10.7.701.B(2) Describe the measures to be taken to reduce, to the extent practicable, the formation of acid and other toxic drainage and to prevent releases that cause federal or state environmental standards to be exceeded –

There is no acidic or other toxic drainage within or out of the water treatment area.

4.3 19.10.7.701.B(3) Describe how applicable federal and state environmental standards and regulations will be met during the duration of standby status and provide to the Director a written determination from the Secretary of the Environment Department stating that the permittee has demonstrated that the operation will be expected to achieve compliance with all applicable air, water quality and other environmental standards of the Environment Department during standby status if carried out as described —

The water treatment area has been void of activity for approximately 20 years. Quarterly inspections of the lagoons and buildings are made to assure the buildings, equipment, and lagoon berms are maintained for future operation. All lagoons remain dry except for lagoon #2 which receives run-off from the plant site area. The NMED has written letters dated May 28, 1999 stating RGR will very likely be in compliance during the standby period by following the current maintenance program. The mine area has not been further disturbed since the 1998 mine permit was issued. All conditions described in that permit and in subsequent standby applications were deemed by NMED to be satisfactorily addressed then and have not changed since.

4.4 19.10.7.701.B(4) Describe how waste and storage units, leach piles, impoundments and pits will be stabilized during the duration of standby status –

The lagoons in the water treatment area, eight in all, have shown only very minor berm deterioration since shut down in June 1990. Due to the very dry environment, water erosion has not caused damage to these facilities. The security fence around the area has discouraged wildlife or domestic animals (except cattle actually brought in for grass and weed control for part of the year - usually four) from entering and causing accelerated water erosion. Annual precipitation averages between eight to ten inches per year.

4.5 19.10.7.701.B(5) Describe how the applicable requirements of the Act and this Part will be met during the term of the standby status for the operations proposed for standby status –

RGR will continue to comply with the conditions and provisions of the Mine Permit Application, Mt. Taylor Closeout Plan, provisions and conditions of the Permit Revision 98-1 and will remain in compliance with NMAC-19.10. Part 7 of the New Mexico Mining Rules. The mine area has not been further disturbed since the 1998 mine permit was issued. All conditions described in that permit and in subsequent standby applications were deemed by MMD to be satisfactorily addressed then and have not changed since.

4.6 19.10.7.701.B(6) Provide an analysis of the anticipated future economic viability of the units proposed for standby status –

The water treatment area is a necessary facility, whether it is used for mining or only for the WSP. It is anticipated that the water treatment area will treat 2000 to 4000 acre feet of water annually. The treated water will be released into a pipeline (to be provided by others and permitted separately) for transport to one or more water users. The WSP is projected to provide positive financial returns for RGR.

5.0 ORE STOCKPILE - 6.8 ACRES

5.1 19.10.7.701.B(1) Identify the projected term of standby status –

The low grade ore stockpile will be on standby until the mine resumes operation. The standby period is expected to be five years, unless uranium markets improve sooner.

5.2 19.10.7.701.B(2) Describe the measures to be taken to reduce, to the extent practicable, the formation of acid and other toxic drainage and to prevent releases that cause federal or state environmental standards to be exceeded –

The low-grade stockpile was covered with uncontaminated soil and rock in 1992. This pile cover shows only minor erosional features, mainly because the cover has developed considerable natural vegetation over the last 18 years. The vegetation cover is expected to improve each year during the standby period.

5.3 19.10.7.701.B(3) Describe how applicable federal and state environmental standards and regulations will be met during the duration of standby status and provide to the Director a written determination from the Secretary of the Environment Department stating that the permittee has demonstrated that the operation will be expected to achieve compliance with all applicable air, water quality and other environmental standards of the Environment Department during standby status if carried out as described —

Drainage from the low-grade stockpile area is collected in a collection basin specifically constructed to collect and retain run-off from the low-grade stockpile and the acreage around the stockpile. The NMED agrees that this area will not produce air or water contaminated discharge during the standby period as stated in letters dated May 28, 1999.

The mine area has not been further disturbed since the 1998 mine permit was issued. All conditions described in that permit and in subsequent standby applications were deemed by NMED to be satisfactorily addressed then and have not changed since.

5.4 19.10.7.701.B(4) Describe how waste and storage units, leach piles, impoundments and pits will be stabilized during the duration of standby status –

The one impoundment in the low-grade stockpile area is inspected each quarter to assure berms and drainage remains in good order. The berms of the impoundment are heavily vegetated and mostly free from cattle and wildlife damage. This facility will be maintained during the standby period in a manner approved by NMED.

5.5 19.10.7.701.B(5) Describe how the applicable requirements of the Act and this Part will be met during the term of the standby status for the operations proposed for standby status –

RGR will continue to comply with the conditions and provisions of the Mine Permit Application, Mt. Taylor Closeout Plan, provisions and conditions of the Permit Revision 98-1 and will remain in compliance with NMAC-19.10. Part 7 of the New Mexico Mining Rules. The mine area has not been further disturbed since the 1998 mine permit was issued. All conditions described in that permit and in subsequent standby applications were deemed by MMD to be satisfactorily addressed then and have not changed since.

5.6 19.10.7.701.B(6) Provide an analysis of the anticipated future economic viability of the units proposed for standby status –

6.0 STORM WATER RETENTION POND - WASTE PILE (2.1 ACRES)

6.1 19.10.7.701.B(1) Identify the projected term of standby status –

Drainage from the waste pile area is collected in a collection basin specifically constructed to collect and retain run-off from the waste pile and the acreage around the waste pile. The NMED agrees that this area will not produce air or water contaminated discharge during the standby period as stated in letters dated May 28, 1999.

6.2 19.10.7.701.B(2) Describe the measures to be taken to reduce, to the extent practicable, the formation of acid and other toxic drainage and to prevent releases that cause federal or state environmental standards to be exceeded –

There is no acidic or other toxic drainage from this unit. The storm water run-off from the old waste pile is directed into this basin where the water is evaporated leaving suspended solids on the floor.

6.3 19.10.7.701.B(3) Describe how applicable federal and state environmental standards and regulations will be met during the duration of standby status and provide to the Director a written determination from the Secretary of the Environment Department stating that the permittee has demonstrated that the operation will be expected to achieve compliance with all applicable air, water quality and other environmental standards of the Environment Department during standby status if carried out as described —

The waste pile run-off impoundment was constructed in 1989 to receive water and silt from any erosion which may occur on the slopes of the waste pile. At present, the basin is still in very good condition and continues to collect run-off from the infrequent heavy rains. The waste pile is inspected on a quarterly basis. NMED approved this facility as stated in letters written May 28, 1999. The mine area has not been further disturbed since the 1998 mine permit was issued. All conditions described in that permit and in subsequent standby applications were deemed by NMED to be satisfactorily addressed then and have not changed since.

6.4 19.10.7.701.B(4) Describe how waste and storage units, leach piles, impoundments and pits will be stabilized during the duration of standby status –

This collection impoundment has been in use for approximately 20 years. There have been no serious erosion problems nor has there been any danger that this impoundment would be filled to capacity so as to threaten breach of any one of the containment berms. Vegetation cover on the berms and the floor of the basin has allowed only minor erosion features. This facility is inspected once per calendar quarter for damage and, if necessary, repairs are scheduled.

RGR will continue to comply with the conditions and provisions of the Mine Permit Application, Mt. Taylor Closeout Plan, provisions and conditions of the Permit Revision 98-1 and will remain in compliance with NMAC-19.10. Part 7 of the New Mexico Mining Rules. The mine area has not been further disturbed since the 1998 mine permit was issued. All conditions described in that permit and in subsequent standby applications were deemed by MMD to be satisfactorily addressed then and have not changed since.

7.0 STORM WATER RETENTION POND - LOW ORE GRADE PILE (1.6 ACRES)

7.1 19.10.7.701.B(1) Identify the projected term of standby status –

This unit will be on standby for another 5 years.

7.2 19.10.7.701.B(2) Describe the measures to be taken to reduce, to the extent practicable, the formation of acid and other toxic drainage and to prevent releases that cause federal or state environmental standards to be exceeded –

There is no acidic or other toxic drainage from the impoundment. This pond was constructed in 1979 and is in very good condition because of low water levels and good vegetation cover on the outer berm surfaces. Very little erosion is evident on either side of the berms. The floor of the basin is covered with one to two feet of shale to prevent percolation of water and contaminants.

7.3 19.10.7.701.B(3) Describe how applicable federal and state environmental standards and regulations will be met during the duration of standby status and provide to the Director a written determination from the Secretary of the Environment Department stating that the permittee has demonstrated that the operation will be expected to achieve compliance with all applicable air, water quality and other environmental standards of the Environment Department during standby status if carried out as described —

This facility has been collecting surface water from the ore pad for approximately 30 years with no evidence of ground water contamination. This history should be sufficiently favorable to allow NMED to give approval for extended standby operation.

The mine area has not been further disturbed since the 1998 mine permit was issued. All conditions described in that permit and in subsequent standby applications were deemed by NMED to be satisfactorily addressed then and have not changed since.

7.4 19.10.7.701.B(4) Describe how waste and storage units, leach piles, impoundments and pits will be stabilized during the duration of standby status –

This impoundment is stabilized with clay and silt floor to prevent ground water contamination and has vegetation cover on the berms to control erosion. Security fencing also limits the damage done by domestic and wild animals.

7.5 19.10.7.701.B(5) Describe how the applicable requirements of the Act and this Part will be met during the term of the standby status for the operations proposed for standby status –

RGR will continue to comply with the conditions and provisions of the Mine Permit Application, Mt. Taylor Closeout Plan, provisions and conditions of the Permit Revision 98-1 and will remain in compliance with NMAC-19.10. Part 7 of the New Mexico Mining Rules.

Rio Grande Resources Corporation (RGR) submitted a Standby Status Renewal Application on or before July 5, 2010 as a revision to its existing Mine Permit No. C1002RE, for its Mt. Taylor Mine in accordance with the provisions of the New Mexico Mining Act, sections 60-1 through 69-36.20, NMSA 1978, as amended, and the New Mexico Mining Act Rules (Rules), 19.10.5 and 19.10.7 of the New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC).

The Mt. Taylor Mine is located in Section 24, T13N, R8W, NMPM in Cibola County, near the village of San Mateo. The mine is an existing uranium mining operation using underground mining techniques to extract uranium ore from depths of over 3000 feet below ground surface using room-and-pillar and stope mining methods. There are no milling facilities within the proposed Standby area. Uranium ore was first produced from the Mt. Taylor Mine in 1979 until September 30, 1982 and again from October 1985 until January 1990. The Mine has been inactive since January 1990 until the present. Standby Status is a technical change only and does not indicate a change in the intended mining activity at the mine. Standby Status was originally approved by the Mining and Minerals Division (MMD) of the New Mexico Energy, Minerals & Natural Resources Department (EMNRD) on October 7, 1999 for a 5 year term. Standby Status was renewed on July 5, 2005 for an additional 5 year term. The current application is for renewal of Standby Status for an additional 5 year term.

The proposed Standby Status Renewal Application includes the plant site and mine support surface facilities consisting of Seven (7) mining units which are: (1)Plant Site - 93 Acres, (2) Old Waste Pile - 15.2 Acres, (3) New Waste Pile 21.7 - Acres, (4) Water Treatment Area - 28 Acres, (5) Low Grade Stockpile Area - 6.8 Acres, (6) Storm Water Retention Pond - Waste Pile - 2.1 Acres, and (7) Storm water Retention Pond - Low Grade Stockpile - 1.6 Acres. The mine is an existing uranium mining operation using underground mining techniques to extract uranium ore from depths of over 3000 feet below ground surface using room-and-pillar and stope mining methods. There are no milling facilities within the proposed Standby area. Uranium ore was first produced from the Mt. Taylor Mine in 1979 until September 30, 1982 and again from October 1985 until January 1990. The Mine has been inactive since January 1990 until the present. Standby Status is a technical change only and does not Indicate a change in the intended mining activity at the mine. Standby Status was originally approved by the Mining and Minerals Division (MMD) of the New Mexico Energy, Minerals & Natural Resources Department (EMNRD) on October 7, 1999 for a 5 year term. Standby Status was renewed on July 5, 2005 for an additional 5 year term. The current application is for renewal of Standby Status for an additional 5 year term.

The proposed Standby Status Renewal Application includes the plant site and mine support surface facilities consisting of Seven (7) mining units which are: (1) plant Site - 93 Acres, (2) Old Waste Pile -15.2 Acres, (3) New Waste Pile 21.7 - Acres, (4) Water Treatment Area- 28 Acres, (5) Low Grade Stockpile Area - 6.8 Acres, (6) Storm Water Retention Pond Waste Pile - 2.1 Acres, and (7) Storm water Retention Pond - Low Grade Stockpile - 1.6 Acres. The Rules require Standby Status to be approved by the EMNRD and requires this Standby Status Renewal Application to be processed.
