
[REDACTED] has paid his debt to our nation for his conviction and, by leading an exemplary life and serving those in need, has earned strong consideration for his Petition for Pardon.


Please accept my humble recommendation that, by serving others so diligently and compassionately, [REDACTED] has earned consideration for a Pardon.
