I was 19 appointed by City Attorney Jan Goldsmith to this position in 2011. As the Executive Assistant 20 City Attorney, among other duties, I am responsible for managing all litigated matters filed 21 against and/or by the City of San Diego. I am also the second in command at the Office of the 22 City Attorney, and as such, I am the Acting City Attorney when he is not available. I have 23 personal knowledge of the following facts, and if called as a witness, I could and would 24 competently testify thereto. 25 2. As the Executive Assistant City Attorney in charge of the Civil Litigation 26 Division, I am responsible for assigning cases, assuring that those cases are handled properly. 27 and approving the Closed Session memos upon which the City Council depends in making a 28 decision in Closed Session. I am responsible for making sure the City Council is fully informed 585774

by the City Attorney's Office before they make their decisions. I am also one of the individuals responsible for insuring that the Brown Act is not violated in Closed Session.

- 3. On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, I was present at the scheduled Closed Session meeting, acting in my capacity as the Executive Assistant City Attorney in charge of the Civil Litigation Division, as well as standing in the shoes of the City Attorney due to his absence.
- 4. After receiving permission from the Mayor's Acting Chief Operating Officer Scott Chadwick, City Council President Todd Gloria started the meeting at the scheduled time of 9:00 AM in the Mayor's absence. Approximately two minutes after the start of the meeting, Mayor Filner arrived at the Closed Session meeting. Mayor Filner immediately verbally attacked Council President Gloria for starting the meeting without him.
- 5. I was standing at the podium waiting for the matter the Council was discussing to be concluded when the Mayor entered the room. I expected that conclusion to occur quickly. It would then be my responsibility to clear the room of anyone who did not have a reason to be involved in the next noticed Closed Session matter. After verbally attacking Council President Gloria, and without hesitation, Mayor Filner began his verbal attack on me. I had not uttered one word before the Mayor proceeded to verbally attack me.
- 6. Mayor Filner asked me to leave the room because it would make him much happier. Mayor Filner accused me of previously violating the confidentiality rules of Closed Session and stated he would take action against me. It was clear to me that Mayor Filner was referring to an incident at a prior Closed Session in roughly late March or early April 2013 when he had ordered me to "go sit in the back of the room" and I had refused to do so.
- 7. Mayor Filner's previous demeaning demand that I "go sit in the back of the room" was not a noticed issue for Closed Session discussion by City Council. There is nothing about that statement that is protected or confidential. Thus, I made a public statement in April 2013 to the press about the incident. Mayor Filner, to my knowledge, has never denied that he made that statement.
- 8. At the Closed Session meeting on June 18, 2013, Mayor Filner ordered me to sit down until I was recognized, repeatedly stated I had violated Closed Session confidentiality

rules, and repeatedly asked me to admit that I had violated such rules. Each time the Mayor asked me whether I had violated confidentiality rules, I answered the Mayor's questions by stating that I had not violated the Brown Act. I then sat down and the verbal attacks stopped.

- 9. At the time, I was somewhat in a state of shock at being attacked without provocation and I was making every effort to compose myself. As a result, I did not completely follow the process when the City Council concluded the matter that was previously being discussed.
- 10. As part of my job duties, it is my responsibility to clear the room of people who are not authorized to attend the Closed Session matter that is being heard, and bring in the next set of presenters. I sought clarification from the Mayor, therefore, in order to decide what should happen next.
- 11. I attempted to ask the Mayor for clarification as to what had happened in order to decide whether I should ask the presenters currently in the room to leave and bring in the next group of presenters, or take some other action depending on the response. It is solely my responsibility to make that decision.
- 12. The Mayor ordered me to sit down and announced that I was not responsible for anything. I refused to sit down and continued to seek clarification. The Mayor threatened to remove me from the room if I did not sit down.
- 13. The Mayor then left the room and I was given the clarification that I was seeking. I had the presenters currently in the room exit the room, and I went to retrieve the next group of presenters from an adjoining room. When I came back into the meeting room with the next set of presenters, the Mayor ordered me to leave the room. I refused and he left the room.
- 14. This time, the Mayor came back into the room with Detective Calvert, who I understood had been providing security for the meeting. The Mayor ordered Detective Calvert to remove me from the room.
- 15. I asked Detective Calvert if he was asking me to leave. Detective Calvert said he was. I asked Detective Calvert to state it for the record. Detective Calvert stated on the record the he was asking me to leave. I was escorted out of the room by Detective Calvert.
