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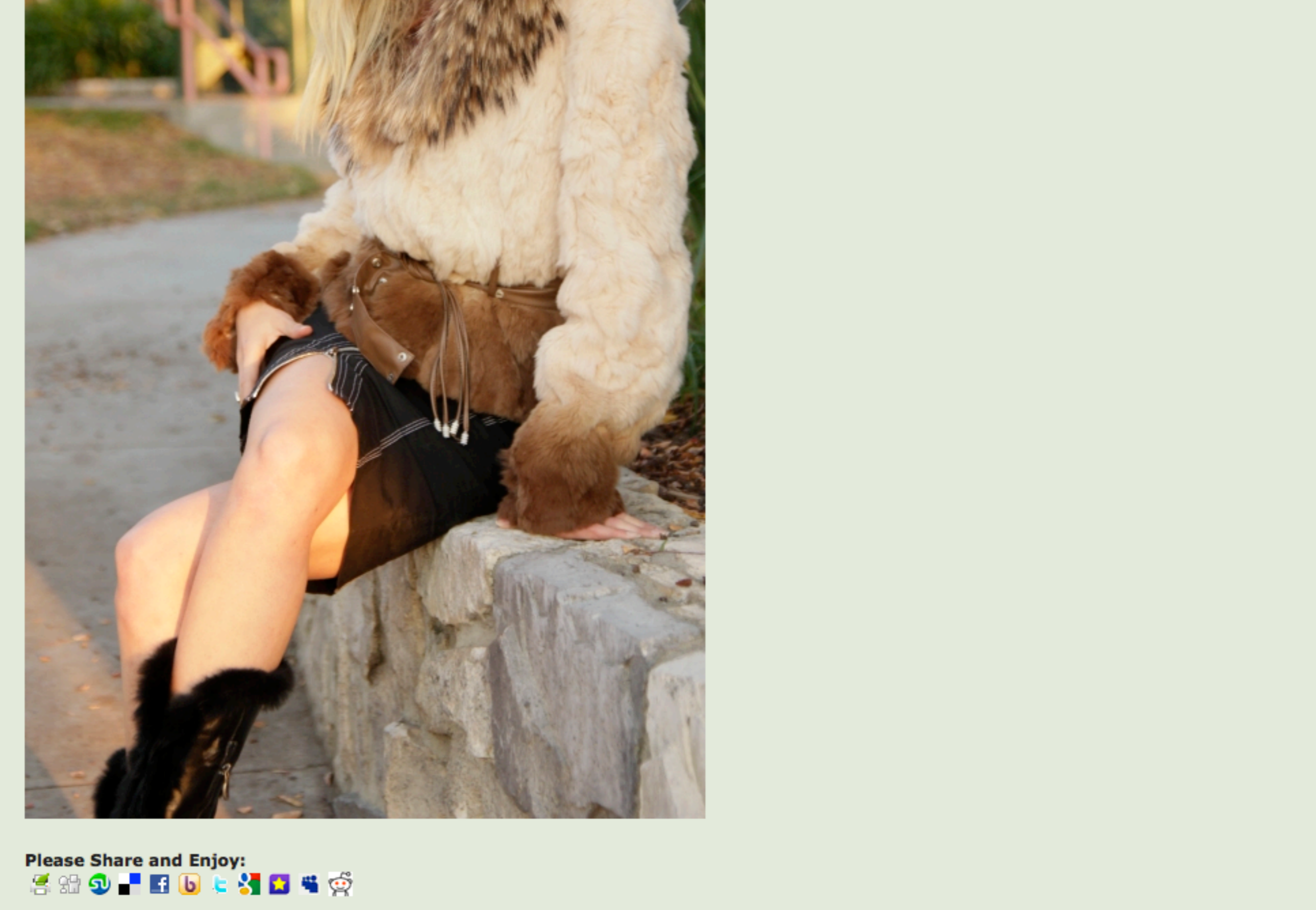

My pleasure! Here's another story. Her businessman arrived in Russia, he noticed that he very frequently got these responses from employees, prospective associates, etc.: "Nyet – it can't be done," and "It is not my responsibility." Very vexing, of course, and he tried to figure out why Russians would so easily resort to these responses. After all, in America you would only say those things to your boss if you actually WANTED to lose your job!

Saying yes, he learned, commits the Russian, and in their experience, something usually happens to screw things up, so there you are holding the bag. Years of living in a top-down bureaucracy has shown them this is a very bad position to be in. But, he learned, "In Russia, everything is difficult and everything is possible." Appealing to the "how" of a problem appeals to the Russian's sense of resourcefulness, a trait Russians tend to have in abundance, after living for generations in a poor and notoriously inefficient run country. "Their penchant for survival has prepared them for getting around the obstacles of life and solutions to get the job done." (Those from more prosperous countries would probably give up after maybe 3 minutes!)

Andresen tells a real-life story that illustrates all this. One Saturday at about midnight, he was returning home after spending a long day in the country with friends. Tired, he stood in the lobby of his building and pushed the button for the elevator. While he waited for it, he got out his keys. In his fatigue, he dropped them and in the blink of an eye, they slid across the smooth stone floor and fell into the wide crevasse between the floor and the elevator. What on earth could he do? The landlady was at her dacha in the country, which didn't have a phone. His driver had no idea, and just wanted to go home to his family and bed; the maintenance man whom he called lived far away and was noncommittal about coming out, understandably. So he sat on a bench, figuring he would sleep there. But after about an hour, the driver who had left him returned with a friend who carried a "horse-shoe magnet" the size of a dinner plate and a long string." He slithered the magnet down the crack between the floor and the elevator and with the aid of a flashlight, they found the keys about 20 feet below. Up came the keys, just as the maintenance man walked through the door with his own solution.

"That's not my responsibility" is often what you get. But if he likes you and you have challenged his ability to solve the problem, the Russian will call on his innate resourcefulness to help."

Andresen certainly makes me like these people!

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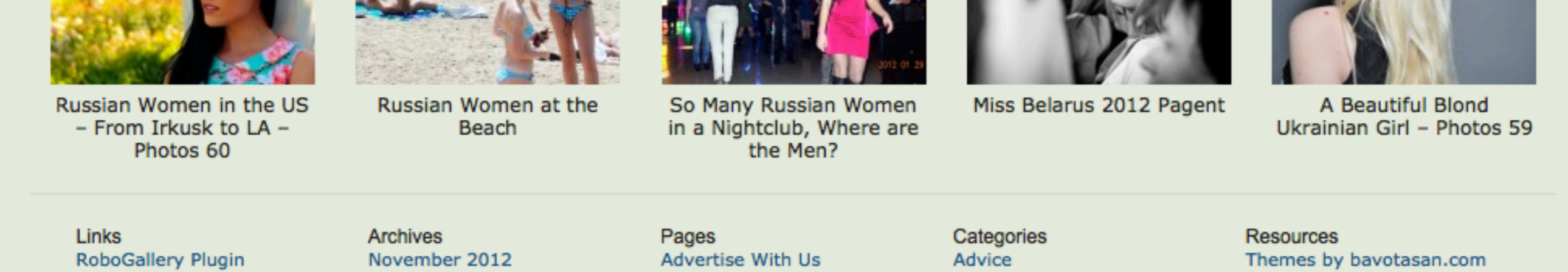
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
