THE UPS AND DOWNS OF BELMONT PARK

THEY'VE TAKEN THE car off the ferris wheel and started re-painting so that they'll look good when the buyers from the International Association of Amusement Parks come around. They've locked up the arcade booths and junk food concessions. Broken glass, air compressors, and beachied plastic whale from Kiddie Land now litter the "funway" between the Scrambler and the Himalayan Coaster. Even "Earthquake," the 75-foot high, 2,800-foot long roller coaster, stands mute against the horizon, somehow ominous in its shroud of silence. Belmont Park, the old-style amusement park at the end of Mission Boulevard, has closed its gates. After 50 years of service to sailors, tourists, and tneboppers, it has fallen victim to a modern American malady—obsolete by reason of unprofitability.

Belmont Park was not St. Louis' first amusement park. That honor goes to Fourth, 1913. Opened in Ocean Beach to an audience of 30,000, it was a success from the start, so much so that it helped to celebrate the event of the mayors, brass bands, and fine displays from Italy. West Coast, Canada, and Australia. A grand review slide ride, a Panama tea garden, and dancing pavilion that could accommodate 650, and even a menagerie of 300 monkeys.

Wonderland lasted two seasons. In 1915 the Panama-Pacific Exposition in Balboa Park drew the crowds away. The park closed in January 1916 without the return of the roller coaster. The park was closed and the park became a gradual shambles. The menagerie was sold off and the animals became part of the new Zoo Garden.

In 1922 the Pacific Coast Amusement Company bought the entire extensive land area of the sand spit known as Mission Beach. Three years later they built a new amusement park there. The Mission Beach Park, which included a new center (Belmont Park) and a roller coaster, cost \$1,000,000.

In July "On Land" was published. The book was well received and won the award for best book on the boat. It was followed by "The Great Seal of the Republic" and "The City of San Francisco". The company then turned its attention to the West Coast, and the longest indoor swimming pool in 1924 the company donated the first swimming pool to the State Commission. That they thought it would be a good way to promote real estate sales. In 1925 the company built the Beach Club. The State Park Commission accepted the gift and until 1937 a Mojarat branch for the city to use.

The city immediately tried to raise money to buy it from Frank Pickering, who had sold it to Mr. Pickering for \$1,200 in 1920. The price was \$2,100 a year or \$26,000 in 1929. Pickering died in 1932. The Governor of California, Frank Merriam, claimed the park, and the city accepted the offer. The city paid \$10,000 in the unused lease back to the city and \$10,000 to the state. They also paid an additional \$10,000 to upgrade the park. The city then had to pay an additional concession fee. They decided however to keep the park open. In 1937 the city built a new, heated indoor swimming pool, and the beach club was closed. 

Old swimmers never die; they just wash ashore every summer at the La Jolla Rock Water Swap or chalk up another lap at the San Diego Beach Plaza. Such might be the judgment of the casual observer who walks past the ornate building that houses the largest indoor swimming pool in San Diego.

There are more than 100,000 laps of back-stroke bodies swimming at an almost hypnotic pace, the water rippling and forth, back and forth, in time to some private entrainment.

Like most other swimmers, lean in their training to clear out the cobwebs in their heads, the kids in the pool are not the only ones in their emotions. But the difference between the swimmer and the coach, and the swimmer, all else being equal, is that the swimmer continues training long after the coach has stopped, forming routine of pushes, laps and dives. And the coach, a worn-out slob, is hooked on the Mission Beach Beach.

Built in 1925, the plunge is considered one of the finest in the northwest corner of Belvoir Park and bears the San Diego Historic Site plaque. It is also a city landmark there are 115 visible in the city on buildings which structures are judged "architecturally and/or historically significant."

Structurally, the plunge is unusual, but unique. It is of the unusual shape and size of a Greek Pavilion in Bahia Park. "It's perfect," the exterior of the plunge is said to be, "but it's not that way because of its arched roof, which is the exact opposite of what you'd expect."

Splendid in the building must have been, but now it shows signs of age. Bulging cracks are visible in the plaster, and from the grand molding that decorates the three original entrances to the building, the letters "M&P" draped elegantly across the front, are starting to fade.

The plunge's lavish interior may be crumbly, but it is still as lithesome and graceful as it always was and as much of its arched roof was, though it's been cut off to accommodate eight racing lanes, the large, ornate windows, the historic swimming meets and aquatic pageants. It was here in 1954 that Tom Warren, 16, of the San Diegans, broke the world record for the 50-meter butterfly. His time: 22.5 seconds. Only remains of the progeny, half of the original interior, now line the upper deck on perma-

near death. The last swim meet was held in 1967.

"It's amazing how history is in this building," says pool manager Tom Warren. "People used to come in the mornings and tell me they were in the Navy. I'd ask them where they were in the Navy." He estimates that over a million people have swum in the pool since it opened in the early 20s. He laughs and then adds, "I learned how to swim when I was 11."

As Tom Warren, the owner of Tom's Swimming School, says, "Everybody who lives around here who's native probably learned how to swim in this pool." Tom Warren, who has been featured in *Sports Illustrated*, is married to his wife for 15 years. "We're all the national champions," he says, referring to the many awards he and his wife have won.

Carrie Reckseck learned to swim there when she was nine. She along with her mother, father, brother, staff, all students, helps to operate

the school.

She has decorated with sharks, sea horses, and Sponge Bob (done by one of the instructors), the walls of the school.

Sometimes we'd play house in the schoolroom, and we'd have tea parties," she says. "But they'd always end up in the water."

The plunge's clientele is not limited to local swimmers and Navy men, and ex-swim team members. According to the Park and Recreation Department, the plunge is one of the busiest pools in the city, despite its four-month closure for renovations (from July until January). Almost 25,000 admissions were recorded last year, and the park department expects 30,000 more this year. "The cost (\$20,000) will make it the most expensive pool ever built," says Tom Warren.

He adds, "It's the national champion-

ship, and we're trying to keep coming in."






